

From Jean-Michel to Brigitte Trogneux, lies at the Elysée

The pressibus.org/brigitte file in short answers to 10 frequently asked questions
Five months of citizen's investigation strewn with false leads and hesitations lead to a new understanding.
Here are the answers that appear to us to be the best in the state of our knowledge in mid-August 2022.

1 Are we sure that Brigitte Macron was born and raised male?

Yes. In 1977, a transsexual calling herself Véronique was interviewed on television. The audio comparison of her voice with that of a recent interview of Brigitte Macron proves that it is the same person. Without going as far as this scientific proof, everyone can realize it by listening to the juxtaposition of the two voices (video of 1 mn 27).

2 Is Brigitte Trogneux married Macron the same person as her brother Jean-Michel?

Yes. Jean-Michel Trogneux, born in 1945, had indeed a sister Brigitte born in 1953, but she died young, around 1959. They are therefore two different people. The wife of Emmanuel Macron is not this Brigitte. She is Jean-Michel who usurped (reincarnated) the identity of his sister, whose death had not been declared, or was erased. It is from about 1984 that Jean-Michel used the identity of his missing sister, thus having her identity card, her social security number, etc.

3 Is Jean-Michel Trogneux the father or the mother of the three Auzière children?

The father. Since he was born a man. After the birth of his youngest daughter Tiphaine around 1984, after having taken the identity of his sister Brigitte, he passed himself off as their mother.

4 What about Brigitte Macron's first marriage to André Louis Auzière in 1974?

It is both real and fictional. Fictitious because the bride was deceased and the groom was imaginary. Real because it was registered in the registry office, without verification of identities

5 Who is the mother of the three Auzière children?

Brigitte Auzière. In 1975, 1977, January 1984, dates of birth of the three children Sébastien, Laurence and Tiphaine Auzière, Jean-Michel has not yet turned into their mother. He is not married to her. In 1980, he even married another woman from whom he had two children in 1982 and February 1984. The three Auzière children bear both the surname of their fictitious father and their mother. There is continuity of the mother's name before and after 1984: before "Brigitte Auzière née Auzière", after "Brigitte Auzière née Trogneux". Knowing that the maiden name fades behind the married name, the mother remained Brigitte Auzière. Thus the father, become woman, took the place of the mother.

6 What became of the mother of the three children?

One does not know. The secret is well kept, we do not know what became of Brigitte Auzière born Auzière after January 1984. She can be dead, seriously ill, exfiltrated under another name... We found of her only a signature.

7 Who imagined such a scenario?

Jean-Louis Auzière. This uncle of Brigitte Auzière, a friend of Jean-Michel's, probably met in Algiers around 1961, had a father and a brother in the secret services. He often uses his middle name, André, to duplicate himself. He therefore invented André Louis Auzière and proved to be effective in concealment.

8 Was the Trogneux family complicit?

Yes. Parents, brothers and sisters were all affected by Brigitte's death around 1959. They were understanding when one of them, tormented by "gender dysphoria", brought her back to life. A pact of silence was established. The three Auzière children also adhered to it.

9 Is the Trogneux family photo from the 1950s doctored?

No, except perhaps in the margins. It shows the parents and their six children in the fall of 1954.

10 Is all this legal?

No. It is prohibited to impersonate a deceased person, whether or not the death has been declared.
